



## **2022 Year-End Survey Results**



## **2022 Project Accomplishments**

- Believe. It. Or. Not. I. Care. (B.I.O.N.I.C.) was named Nonprofit of the Year by the Applewood Business Association.
- Chris Anthony Youth Initiative Project was recognized by Supreme Court Justice Gorsuch, who also did a school program with Chris Anthony.
- Colorado Agrivoltaic Learning Center hosted a webinar in December and 170 people from all over the world attended.
- Families Forward Resource Center became a national affiliate of the national Parents as Teachers program in September.
- Grand Valley Resident Team received \$75,000 to give out to the community as part of their energy assistance program.
- In Lak'ech Denver Arts launched a youth Mariachi Program and Youth Visual Arts Program in Westwood.
- Juntos created a DACA Renewal Grant fund and helped dozens of Coloradans renew their work permit.
- Man Therapy had 300,000 visits to the website, completed 30,000 head inspections, and was included in an efficacy study by the CDC that proved that Man Therapy is effective in reducing suicidal ideation in working-age men.
- Outreach Fort Collins doubled their service area by expanding into Midtown Fort Collins.
- The Efshar Project was 1 of 10 organizations selected for Upstart Venture Accelerator, which provided \$100,000 in funding and intensive coaching and leadership development.
- Wild Beautiful Orchestra initiated the Youth Showcase concerts, in which over fifteen young musicians get to take the spotlight and be accompanied by our orchestra.

## **2023 Project Goals**

- Assuring Better Child Health and Development will launch a new vision, mission, and strategic plan in Q1.
- Colorado Afterschool Partnership plans to launch and Annual Best of Colorado Afterschool award.
- Community Hire plans to raise \$500,000 this year to support the AmeriCorps planning grant they received from Serve Colorado.
- Golden Triangle Creative District plans to work with a Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (JEDI) consultant and set JEDI goals.
- Growing Up Boulder will work with the City of Boulder transportation department to make busy streets in Boulder safer and more enjoyable for kids and will work with teens to determine an ongoing communication mechanism between police and youth.
- Heart of Saguache and KV received \$440,000 over 3 years to expand their advocacy and outreach.
- High Rockies Harm Reduction plans to expand direct services to 9 total rural counties.
- Mile High Health Alliance and Bringing Music to Life have long-term Executive Directors who are leaving in 2023.
- Social Venture Partners Denver will be rolling out a program to support BIPOC+ businesses.
- Sustainable Neighborhood Network will expand to two new cities.
- Unrestricted Revolution will have their podcast up and running by March.
